A. Personal Statement

As a published Health Informatics and Information Systems Security Practitioner-Scholar, I have: (a) 35+ years of senior-level IT management experience across several business sectors and 5 countries; (b) two Master's degrees (information systems management and adult & distance education), and (c) the following IT industry recognized certifications – A+, Network+, Security+ and CySA+. During this time, I have also obtained 25+ years of 3rd grade – graduate level experience (classroom and leadership). Additionally, I possess 25+ years of developing and sustaining community-academic partnerships. These partnerships are devoted to combining health informatics and participatory research principles to create, implement and evaluate frameworks that build college students' capacity to assist under-resourced minority communities enhance their memberships' resilience to behaviorally triggered biological and electronic infections (i.e. diabetes, HIV, ransomware and other forms of malware).

Currently, I'm pursuing an Ed.D. at Tennessee State University focusing on digital cyber-hygiene simulations as co-curriculars (Fall 2024 completion). As a teaching graduate assistant, I assist in building the capacity of students and leaders at 46+ HBCUs and in three African countries to create and implement digital resources for dismantling structures that perpetuate community-level health and digital literacy inequities. Additionally, on behalf of the National Cybersecurity, I oversee the following initiatives.

• State of Wisconsin High School Cybersecurity Curriculum Pilot Initiative:

Assisting in overseeing the development, facilitation and evaluation of a cybersecurity educational experiences for high students for 15 out of 421 school districts. Using Teach Cyber and Project Lead The Way curricula as the framework, this initiative focuses on: (a) identifying the appropriate programming scope and sequencing for cybersecurity curricula that aligned with ALL of the State CTE outcomes; (b) co-design and co-facilitate summer professional development sessions for the new teachers and incumbent teachers; and (c) provide on-going support to the teacher and their schools throughout the school year.

Detroit Teaching Assistant Project Initiative:

Developing and facilitating STEM+Coding Enrichment Programming for 3rd - 5th grade students every Friday; and (b) overseeing STEM+Cybersecurity Enrichment Programming for 6th - 8th grade students every Friday. For the 2023-2024 school, both programs will be combined into an in-school Cybersecurity focused Science class for 5^{th} grade scholars at the Detroit Academy of Arts and Science. As part of this class, students will be prepared for the domains of the TestOut Digital Literacy Pro and the EC-Council Certified Secure Computer User certification exams.

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• Regional Cybersecurity Capabilities and Career Symposia:

Designing and implementing Regional Cybersecurity Capabilities and Career Symposia (3CS). The best programs and events at each regional event will be awarded a slot at the national annual conference, along with nationally-oriented programming, such as the annual meetings of the National Cybersecurity Student Association and the annual meeting of the hubs (nonprofits) and spokes (universities and colleges) involved in National CyberWatch's Skill Up to Scale Up and Cyber Ready Professionals programs for workforce training and student resident internships, respectively.
