Facts about Michigan road commissions:

Approximately 75% of all Michigan roads are under the jurisdiction of countywide governmental agencies known as road commissions.

Road commissions design, build and maintain all roads and bridges under their jurisdiction.

The Michigan road commissions as a whole have an industry association called the County Road Association of Michigan. https://micountyroads.org/ The UPRBA is a sectional association within the County Road Association. https://micountyroads.org/people/councils/

Each county road commission is required by state statute to have a professional engineer to oversee the operations.

Public Act 149 of 1893 allowed counties to create road commissions, so many road commissions are over 100 years old. https://micountyroads.org/About/CRA-100th-Anniversary/
