Director Mark Levinson, a physicist turned filmmaker, follows six brilliant scientists during the launch of the Large Hadron Collider.

Particle Fever is a 2013 <u>documentary film</u> tracking the first round of experiments at the <u>Large</u> <u>Hadron Collider</u> near <u>Geneva</u>, <u>Switzerland</u>. The film follows the <u>experimental physicists</u> at <u>CERN</u> who run the experiments, as well as the <u>theoretical physicists</u> who attempt to provide a conceptual framework for the LHC's results. The film begins in 2008 with the first firing of the LHC and concludes in 2012 with the successful identification of the <u>Higgs boson</u>.^[2]
